

**A Report to the Mayor and City Council

Fulfilling Requirements of the Texas Racial Profiling Law (Senate Bill Number 1074)
For 2012**

Introduction:

The following constitutes the eleventh annual report of traffic stop data required under Senate Bill Number 1074. The statute mandates that this report, detailing law enforcement activity for the previous year, be filed with the Mayor and City Council before March 1st. House Bill 3389 now requires all agencies to file an annual online racial profiling report to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE) at www.tcleose.state.tx.us, as well as their governing body.

Every law enforcement agency in Texas which makes routine traffic stops must collect and report Tier 1 data. Tier 2 data must be collected and reported if you do not have audio-visual equipment in every motor vehicle regularly used to make traffic stops.

Tier 1 data includes the following information relating to **traffic** stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:

- The race or ethnicity of the individual detained (African, Asian, Caucasian, Hispanic, Middle Eastern, or Native American; and
- Whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search; and
- Whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual.

The Port Neches Police Department is only required to report Tier 1 data as all patrol vehicles regularly used to conduct traffic stops are equipped with mobile video recorders.

Table 1 shows the breakdown of the total number of traffic stops conducted by Port Neches Police officers in 2012. Table 2 below will show the total tickets, searches and arrests by demographics from

the table 1 data. Additionally, Jefferson County demographics will be compared to the same data used in the Port Neches demographics. I believe that the Jefferson County demographics more accurately represent traffic stop data than just the Port Neches Demographics. The demographics of Port Neches alone do not accurately represent the pass-through traffic that makes up a large portion of our traffic stop data. There are several refineries both to the north and south of our city limits. There is extensive vehicular traffic from employees and service oriented personnel that travel through our city to and from these refineries and other businesses. By comparing the Jefferson County demographics to the traffic stop data I believe that it will more closely represent the motoring public that pass through the City of Port Neches.

Table 3 illustrates traffic stops involving only Port Neches residents as it compares to the demographics of Port Neches. Residents of the City of Port Neches make up 45% of the total traffic stops.

Summary

In 2012 Port Neches police officers conducted 2985 traffic stops. The officers were required to collect racial profiling data on 948 of those traffic stops that resulted in a citation and/or arrest. The remaining 2037 traffic stops did not result in a citation or arrest and therefor were not reportable for the purposes of racial profiling data. As you can see from the data above, there is no indication of racial profiling and there were no complaints of racial profiling as a result of traffic stops in 2012.
